DAY 1: USA – Russia

Depart on your overnight flights to Russia.

(in-flight meals)

Day 2: St. Petersburg

Upon your arrival, meet our guides in the hall after exiting customs, and transfer to your first class hotel for check in. This evening meet your cruise manager and enjoy dinner and a night in St. Petersburg. (D)

Day 3: St. Petersburg

After breakfast, check-out of your hotel and board your bus for the morning panoramic city tour. One of the most beautiful in the world, the city is located on the banks of the Gulf of Finland, in the delta of the river Neva. With over six million inhabitants, it is the second largest city in Russia and because of its many canals, bridges and architectural beauty, St. Petersburg is often referred to as the “Venice of the North”. Peter and Paul Fortress, burial site of Russian Tzars, will end your tour. After, transfer to the river port to board your floating hotel for lunch and check-in. An informational meeting will precede dinner. Tonight explore your ship, or take part in an optional cultural performance. (B, L, D)

Day 4: St. Petersburg

This morning is reserved for a tour of the Hermitage Museum, one of the greatest museums of the world. Located within the 1000+ room Winter Palace, the Hermitage boasts of over 3 million artifacts spread out of 365 rooms and featuring an amazing collection of art dating from the early Greek to modern times! After the tour, return to the ship for lunch or partake in one of the optional excursions. (B,L,D)

Day 5: St. Petersburg

Today is a full free day to explore the sights and sounds of St. Petersburg on your own, or take advantage of one of our optional tours offered by our cruise managers. A free shuttle bus will be available to take you from the port to the city center. Or take the highly recommended optional Palace Tour. Tonight as the ship prepares to sail, enjoy a welcome cocktail, safety briefing and introduction to your Captain and crew as you wave goodbye to St. Petersburg. (B,L,D)

Day 6: Mandrogi

After breakfast, enjoy a walking tour through this authentic replica of a 19 century Russian Village. Afterwards, instead of lunch on board, you will enjoy a unique picnic lunch riverside! The Russian shashlik (kebob) barbeque will be accompanied with entertainment provided by our on-board musicians. Then, be sure to visit the unique Vodka Museum featuring over 2500 varieties of Russia's national drink! (B,L,D)

Day 7: Kizhi

Take a leisurely walking tour of this fairy tale island, situated in the northern part of Lake Onega.

Kizhi is unique as the site of an outdoor museum which represents the picturesque rural wooden architecture of the region. Its most famous landmark, the Church of Transfiguration with its 22 cupolas, is an outstanding masterpiece of wooden architecture. Not only is it constructed without a single nail or piece of iron, but the only tools that were used for its construction were chisels and axes. Back on board our afternoon activities include a blini and caviar tasting and a folk show performed by our on board entertainers. (B, L, D)

Day 8: Goritzky

Enjoy on board activities and lectures in the morning. This afternoon, stop at a typical small Russian village along Volga. Here you will visit an authentic peasant house where your host will welcome you to her home and treat you to some tasty homemade cookies and tea! (B,L,D)

Day 9: Yaroslavl

Founded by Yaroslav the Wise in the 11th century, the city is one of the oldest in Russia. Its primary attractions are in the area around the main square anchored by the Governor's Palace. Your city tour will include a visit to the Transfiguration of the Savior Monastery dating from the 13th century and the Church of Elijah the Prophet. (B, L, D)

Day 10: Uglich

Enjoy a walking tour of Uglich, famous for the more troubled and violent side of Russian history. It was here that the Russian crowned prince Dimitri was assassinated, which eventually led to Boris Godunov ascending the Russian throne. Here on the banks of the Volga, you can also find a rich collection of Russian Orthodox architecture which you will get to see, as well as the Church of St. Demetrius of the Blood and the Palace of Tsarevich Dmitri. Once on board, get ready for the Captain's Farewell Gala Dinner. (B, L, D)

Day 11: Moscow


Enjoy the views as you approach Moscow around lunchtime. Moscow, the capital of Russia, is situated between the banks of the rivers Oka and Volga. A metropolis of 11+ million people, Moscow today is not only the seat of the Russian government but also home to many world renowned attractions. Tonight enjoy a city sightseeing tour, or some option excursions that are available. (B, L, D)

Day 12: Moscow

This morning get an inside look at the Kremlin and its fascinating Cathedrals, as well as the gargantuan Tzar Cannon and the giant Tzar Bell. Then continue on to the fabulous Armory museum, the world renowned depository of Royal Russian riches including samples of weapons, carriages, thrones and the famous Faberge eggs. The remainder of the day is free to explore some more on your own or to join one of the optional excursions, such as an excursion to the Sergiev Posad Complex, the heart of the Russian Orthodox Church, a visit to Tratyakov Gallery or the Pushkin Museum, or a tour of the famous Moscow Metro and pedestrian Arbat Street. This evening there is an optional national dance show or Moscow by night tour. (B, L, D)

Day 13: Moscow - USA

Bid your crew and fellow passengers goodbye as you disembark and transfer to the airport for your return flight home. (B)



Meet Your Ship: The MS Sergei Yesenin

Originally built for the Russian elite, the M/S Sergei Yesenin was refurbished in 2013 and with the remodel of cabins into 4 Jr suites and 2 Grand suites now holds a maximum of only 96 passengers! With just 2 decks, both above water, all cabins are outward facing and feature big picture windows that open, two twin sized berths, tiled bathrooms with separate showers, flat screen TV's with international channels, mini-safes, hair dryers, A/C and plenty of storage space. The public areas include a 100 seat restaurant with panorama windows, an observation room/library, a concert hall on the sun deck and a spacious evening lounge/bar. Free Wifi available in public areas (while in major ports). A young and vivacious crew of 42 plus live entertainers and excellent English speaking Cruise managers will ensure that you have a memorable Russian cruise experience!
